- Currently has 345,000 students and members in 170 countries
 - ... approximately 940 students enrolled with the ACCA/MIA Joint Examination Scheme
 - Enables you to become a Chartered Certified Accountant

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Entry Requirements

○ Professional Examination Route

n Must be at least 18 years of age and have obtained one of the following:

- Two (2) Advanced passes and three (3) Ordinary passes in five separate subjects (including English and Mathematics in either 'A' or 'O' Levels)
 - *AAT (UK) Intermediate*
 - BSc (Hons.) Accounting and Finance
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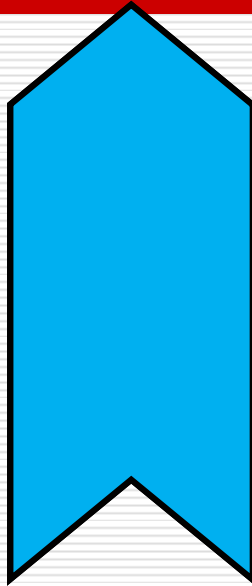
Entry Requirements

....continued

- Degree (from a recognised institution)
 - ACCA Certified Diploma in Accounting and Finance
 - ACCA Diploma in Financial Management
 - n Mature Student Entry Route
 - Preferably over 21 years and involved in work related to Accountancy
 - Must pass Papers MMA (F2) and MFA (F3) within two years from date of first examination session

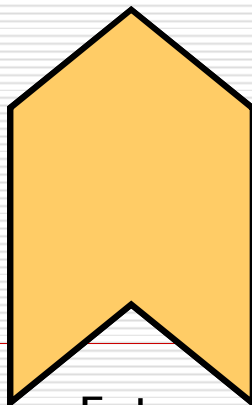

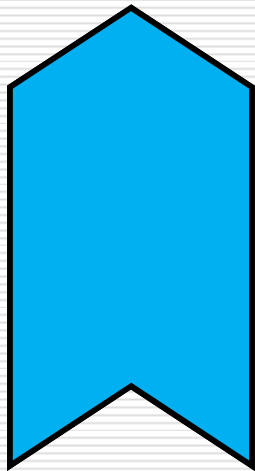
Entry

The Fundamentals level has two modules – **Knowledge and Skills.**

For certain ACCA Accredited degrees full exemption from the Fundamentals Level may be granted.

P7 Adv Audit & Assurance (AAA)

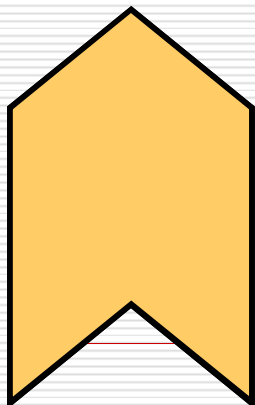
P6 Adv Taxation (ATX)

The Professional level is divided into two modules – **Essentials** and **Options**.

Professional Level exams are three hours long and are paper-based.

Local Variant Papers

- Three local variant papers: -
 - n F4 Corporate and Business Law (Malta Variant)
 - n F6 Taxation (Malta Variant)
 - n P6 Advanced Taxation (Malta Variant)
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The Process

- q Modules must be sat in the following order: Knowledge, Skills, Essentials and Options.
 - q Up to four exams may be taken at any sitting and exams may be taken in any order as long as the modules are attempted in order.
 - q Knowledge module exams are all
 - q Multiple choice questions
 - q 2 hours long
 - q Can be sat as computer or paper-based exams.
 - q The Skills module and all Professional Level exams are three hours long and are paper-based.
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Professional Ethics Course

- q Must be completed before finally applying for membership
 - q Available online, on CD-ROM or paper-based
 - q Made available once eligible to take P1 (Professional Accountant)
 - q Best taken when – or before – sitting P1
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When to Register

- For the December examinations
 - n Register by 31st July of the same year

 - For the June examinations
 - n Register by 15th December of the preceding year
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Fees for 2009

- Registration Fee
 - n ACCA: Stg. 66
 - n MIA: €49
 - Annual Subscription (payable on 1 January following date of registration)
 - n ACCA: Stg.66
 - n MIA: €49
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BSc (Hons) in Applied Accounting

- Partnership between ACCA and Oxford Brookes University
 - Indicate on the initial registration form
 - Submit a Research and Analysis Project (not exceeding 6,500 words) and a Key Skills Statement (not exceeding 2,000 words)
